The Level 2 Diploma in light vehicle maintenance and repair (principles) is assessed in college via online testing.

The Level 2 Diploma in light vehicle maintenance and repair (competence) is assessed through the creation of an NVQ portfolio including job cards and assessor observations acquired in the work-place.

Level 3 Advanced Apprenticeship in Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair.

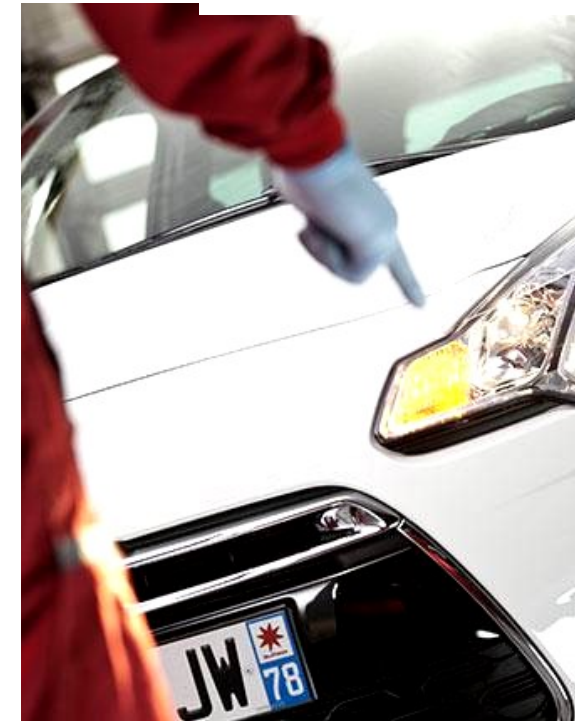


Progression Options

Level 2 Diploma in light vehicle maintenance and repair (principles)

Units include:

- Identify and agree customer vehicle needs
- Identify faulty components/units which affect system performance
- Remove and replace vehicle components/units
- Prepare new, used or repaired vehicles for customer use
- Maintain effective working relationships
- Maintain the health, safety and security of the working environment

- Level 2 Diploma in light vehicle maintenance and repair (competence)
- Functional Skills in English, Math's and ICT (Level 1)
- Employment Rights and Responsibilities (ERR)
- Personal learning and Thinking Skills (PLTS)

Where a course is aimed towards an assessment/examination, it is expected that all students will enter for the qualification.

If you are aged under 19 and if you do not hold a GCSE grade C or higher in English and Math's, you will be required to work towards these qualifications.

Entry Requirements

4 GCSEs at grade D or above including Math's and English.

You need to be employed in the Motor Trade so that practical work may be added to your underpinning knowledge.

Registration Requirements: Registration with City & Guilds of London Institute awarding body is required by those who wish to obtain the qualification. You may register at the college during enrolment.
